

Design Story

This artwork is built from five books—
each wrapped in Palestinian embroidery, the keffiyeh pattern, and the olive motif.
Not as decoration, but as proof that identity here is inherited, not invented.

The embroidery of olive branches speaks of roots that do not surrender.
The keffiyeh pattern stands for a people who remain visible, unbroken, and
present—no matter how many times history tries to erase them.

She chose five books deliberately.
They represent the five wars "Rozan" lived through as a Palestinian designer,
wars that exhausted her, shaped her, and taught her that survival itself is a form of
resistance.

Beneath the books, the message stands clear and final:

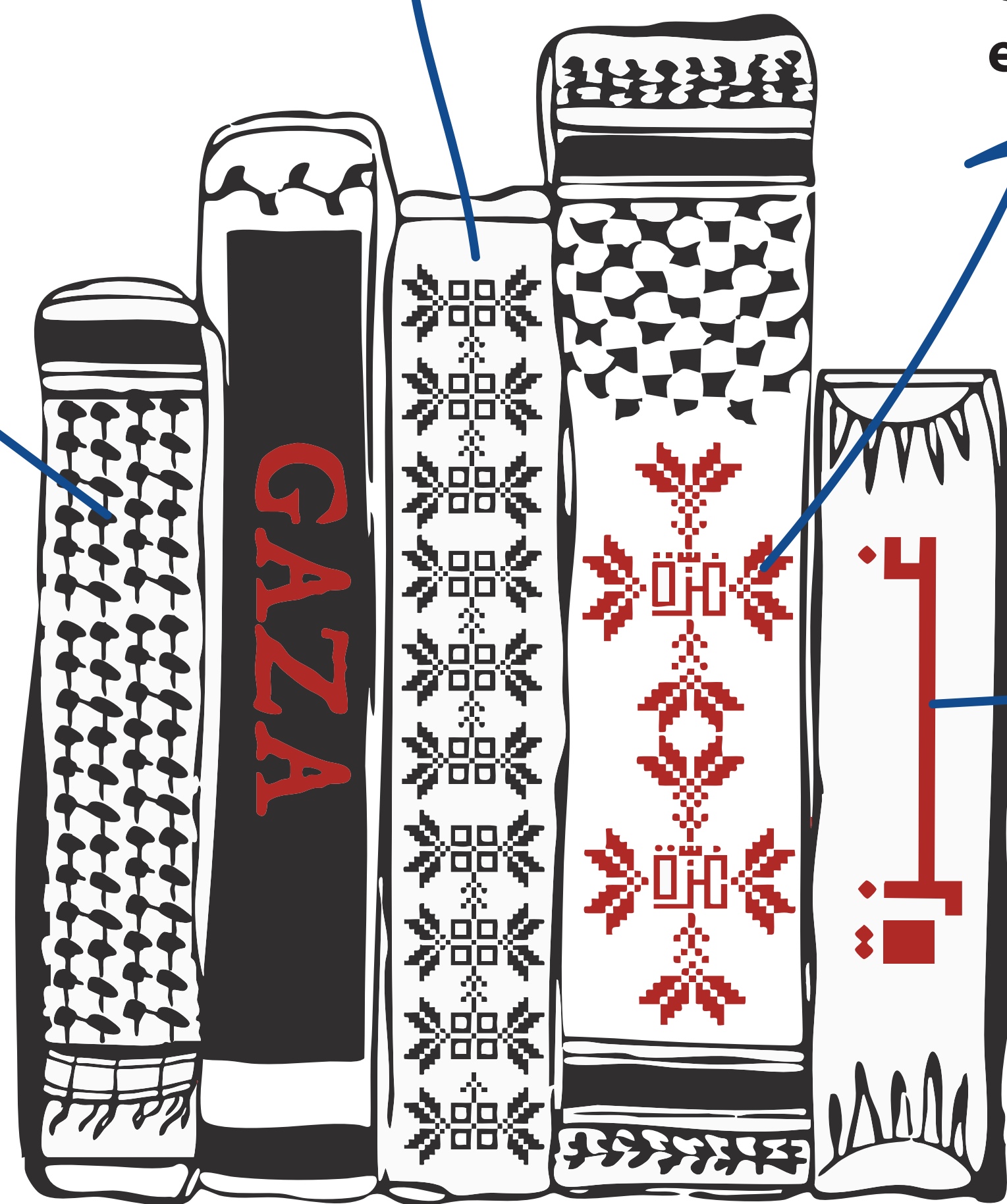
"We remain.
